### STUDENTS OPPOSE UMT

A vigorous protest against the Towe Bill for military conscription was made by students at Syracuse recently. Three thousand students demonstrated their opposition in rallies, and more than 50 students made a protest trip to Washington. The students urged that the money be spent, instead, to further the educational movement in the U.S.
