

N.A.A.C.P. Plans Film and Debate

The NAACP meeting will be held on Thursday, November 12, at 7:00 p. m. in the Social Science Building, room 6. At this meeting plans will be made to make a half hour film strip concerning the Migrant Labor Reform Campaign in Pennsylvania and a radio broadcast. The NAACP will be working with the Pennsylvania Citizens Committee on Migrant Labor. Bob Blake of Cap and Dagger has consented to help write the radio script, and Professor Hoffman has consented to help with the technical affairs. Help in filming, writing, and engineering would be appreciated.

The NAACP is also sponsoring a debate on Wednesday, November 18, at 7:00 p. m. in the Social Science Building. The purpose of this meeting is to attempt to dramatize some of the educational and segregational cases recently before the Supreme Court. This is being presented in conjunction with the Speakers Bureau. The panel will be composed of four students: Bob Burnett, Bill Golightly, Ronald McCrerry, and Robert Driver. The names of judges are not yet known.

Later in the year, the NAACP is planning to have a benefit performance for the Betty Ann Quinn scholarship fund. They are bringing in well known entertainers for the occasion.
