AN ACT

Declaring the policy of the Commonwealth with regard to discriminatory practices in educational institutions based upon race religion color ancestry or national origin prohibiting such discriminatory practices providing for procedure and enforcement providing for judicial review providing for administration by the Pennsylvania Fair Employment Practice Commission in the Department of Labor and Industry and defining its functions powers and duties hereunder.

1 Section 4 Unfair Educational Practices (a) It shall be an unfair educational
2 practice for an educational institution

3 (1) To exclude or limit or otherwise discriminate because of race religion
4 color ancestry or national origin against any student or students seeking admission
5 as students to such institutions Provided That it shall not be unfair educational
6 practice for any educational institution to use criteria other than race religion
7 color ancestry or national origin in the admission of students

8 (2) To make any written or oral inquiry prior to admission concerning or
9 designed to elicit information as to the race religion color ancestry or national
10 origin of a student seeking admission to such institution

11 (3) To expel suspend punish deny facilities or otherwise discriminate
12 against any student or group of students because of race religion color ancestry

(4) To penalize or discriminate against any individual because he has initiated testified participated or assisted in any proceedings under this act

SECTION 10. (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to discriminate against any individual because he has initiated testified participated or assisted in any proceedings under this act.

SECTION 11. (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to discriminate against any individual because he has initiated testified participated or assisted in any proceedings under this act.
