

NAACP CONFERENCE ON MIGRANT LABOR ISSUE TO BE HELD SATURDAY

The Bucknell Chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People is sponsoring a one-day conference to be held on Saturday, May 17 in an effort to focus greater attention upon the problems and conditions of workers engaged in migratory labor. Prominent persons will be representing national and local civic organizations, as well as federal and state governmental agencies.

Registration of all delegates and interested persons will begin at 9 a. m. in Hunt Hall Rec Room. The first session begins at 9:30 a. m. and the conference will close at 8:30 p. m. This conference is open to the public.

Underhill, consultant on Race Relations State Department of Labor and Industry and professor of economics and sociology at Lafayette College.

The session at 9:30 will be followed by a report on Surveys and conditions in Pennsylvania at 11:00. Recent accomplishments and future plans of agencies in the state will be heard at 2 o'clock with a discussion and question period scheduled for 3:00. Dinner will be at 5:30 and the summary of the conference will be given at 7:30 p. m.
