Dear Mr. Brown:

I have written to Walter Prosser at the Institute of African-American Relations to confer with him about sending you our Committee on Foreign Student Admissions has reviewed our situation a bit further. We feel that we would be in a position to offer a substantial scholarship to an African student at either the junior or senior level or as a graduate student. I think if we are going to consider any student who is now in the United States, we should do it at the graduate level. We are very reticent about taking transfer students. Between our scholarship offerings and work, the gap which the student would need to fill in would amount to about \$400 or \$500. Our scholarship aid for graduate students is a bit more liberal than those for undergraduates. I wrote to you about this matter in February. We have a new university administration, and it has taken sometime to get our lines clear on next year's foreign student scholarships. If you have the transcripts on one or two students which you would like to submit to us, we would be pleased to review them. I am also writing to Walter Prosser at the IIE.
