NAACP JOINS NATIONAL IN FIGHT FOR FREEDOM

NAACP is taking an active part this year in the programs and campaigns of the national organization in Washington. A nation-wide program, "The Fighting Fund for Freedom", was established recently to achieve complete equality within ten years, for all negroes. In attaining their goal to stop discrimination, the association hopes to raise one million dollars a year, in each of these ten years, but as yet no quota has been set for Bucknell. The local NAACP chapter is planning a courtroom drama, presenting the same issues and debates of the supreme court to familiarize Bucknellians with the basis for this campaign.

At a gathering October 16, at the home of Dr. Harry Garvin, Bucknell NAACP members met with Mr. J. G. Sholl, a Bucknell alumnus, from the New Jersey Migrant Labor Board. Methods were discussed for the establishment of a child care center in Pennsylvania, which would provide care for farmers' children, usually left alone while their parents are at work.
