Discovered by Booker T. Washington - called to Tuskegee - a wizard in agricultural chemistry - made a member of the Royal Arts Society of London - winner of the Spingarn Medal in 1923 - asked by Edison to work with him on rubber experiments - remains in the Southland where his interest is -
