A delegation from Bucknell will pay a similar visit to Virginia Union on April 1-4 as part of the intercultural exchange.

Following a dinner in the university cafeteria, the visitors were entertained Thursday evening at a reception at the home of Rev. and Mrs. Wesley Shrader, 637 Taylor Street.

The group from Virginia attended a luncheon today at the home of Professor and Mrs. J. Ben Austin, and the visiting students were guests at a coffee hour sponsored by Bucknell's International Club at 4:30 this afternoon. This evening the visitors will have dinner at Tau Kappa Epsilon Fraternity.

Tomorrow there will be a tour of the art exhibits in the Ellen Clarke Bertrand Library at 11 a.m., and in the afternoon the delegation from Virginia will join Bucknell students and faculty members for a round-table conference and dinner at the University's Conference Center in Cowan.

Dr. Elizabeth T. McLaughlin, assistant professor of English at Bucknell, will lead the discussion of James Baldwin's essays, "The Quest of Home."
