EXCHANGE WEEKENDS PLANNED FOR MARCH

As a step toward furthering racial understanding in the United States and throughout the world, students from Bucknell and Howard University will participate in two exchange weekends, March 8-10 and March 22-24. The first weekend will be spent at Howard, the second on Bucknell's campus.

Howard University, with an enrollment of 6,000 students, is located in Washington, D. C. It is (as stated by the university pamphlet) "the largest institution for higher education for Negroes in the United States and is likewise the only comprehensive University system designed primarily for them." Students attend from 40 states and 24 foreign countries.

In both of the exchange programs, participants will attend classes and musical programs, join in discussions pertinent to understanding the racial problem, etc, Although still open to change, plans for activities at Bucknell include swimming, an afternoon at Cowan, the musical program at Davis Gym, and general discussion.
