

Howard Choir Proceeds Go To Howard-Bucknell Exchange

A concert by the Howard University Choir, under the direction of Warner Lawson, dean of the School of Music, will be presented at Bucknell on Fri. evening, April 20.

The Howard Choir is not just another college choir but one that is rated among the nation's best. It has received headline praises from coast to coast and from Canada to Argentina. This choir has not only performed in nearly every large city in the East but has been invited to sing at many State Department and Administration functions. During the summer of 1960, the choir toured 18 nations of South America and performed for nearly 220,000 persons. Upon their return they were commended by Heath Bowman, chief of the State Department's presentations division.

Although the praises heaped on this choir might imply professionalism, it is comprised of college students who join the choir as an extra-curricular activity. These students work just as hard as any varsity team, and the "practice session," every noon, sounds vastly superior to the average "finish-ed group."

The proceeds of the concert will be used to subsidize the Howard University-Bucknell semester student exchange program. This
