I attended the first panel of discussion after having heard Dr. Lundenman's opening address. In this address he told of his experiences with German P.O.W's and their various reaction to the American racial problems - Very interesting.

The panel discussion that night covered racial, or rather minority problems on a World scope. Various suggestions were presented as to how the minority problems in the World affected International Peace. In fact the entire conference, panel discussions and all, dealt with the problems of International Peace nearly as much as ^{with} the minority problems.

Although I didn't hear Dr. Bayard Rustin's speech on Sunday due to time limitations, he attended our panel and very effectively presented the problem of the American negro at this time.
